The hotel as a complimentary shuttle from the airport. Breakfast is included in the rate and will be served in the above mentioned hospitality room.

Also, upon making the reservation, MAKE SURE YOU GET A CONFIRMATION NUMBER! In most cases, they will email you the confirmation. Also check the dates you reserved to make sure they are right.
