Daniel J Casey-Shipmate Daniel deployed on Eternal Patrol on 30 June 2024 at HCA Fawcett Memorial Hospital in Port Charlotte, FL. Born on August 17, 1950 in New Bedford, Ma. He was the son of Harold and Anita Casey. He reported aboard the and qualified on the USS BANG in 1972 as a Torpdeoman. He was a member of the turnover crew to the Cosme Garcia. He served on the USS FIN-BACK SSN670, the USS TIRU SS416, the USS SILVERSIDES SSN 679, the USS GEORGE C MARSHALL SSBN654, the USS ALEXANDER HAMILTON SSBN617, and the USS ULYSSES S GRANT SSBN631. He retired from the Navy as a TorpedomansMate First Class in 1988. He was always interested in all types of cars ... as long as they weren't Fords. Daniel was a member of the USS SAILFISH base of the United States Submarine Veterans.

Myron "Scott" Fiene-Shipmate Myron Fiene embarked on Eternal Patrol on July22,2024. Born on January 11, 1944 in Hilo Hawaii, he joined the Navy on his 18th birthday and was stationed in San Diego for Basic Training. After submarine school he reported to The USS BANG and was qualified in 1964. He was also assigned to the USS SCORPION in 1965. Scott was honorably discharged in 1969 as a Yeoman First Class. He was a long time member of the Lodi California American Legion Post 22, and an active member of the Mare Island Base of the Submarine Veterans. Myron was buried with military honors in the Punch Bowl National Cemetery in Honolulu, Hawaii.
