

A while back I received the following email from Sue Groh who happens to be the daughter of **James Warden, Ltjg, (43-44, WP1,2,3,4).**

“My father, James ES Warden (1917-2010), served on the Bang for 4 war patrols during WW2. He wrote a diary during that time of his training and the patrols he experienced as an officer. I took that diary and pictures I had and created a digital scrapbook. I think you would love to see it and read it for its authentic capturing of the sentiments, emotions, excitement and pride of being part of history at a time of great uncertainty but profound necessity. I can send a hard copy and also DVD for your enjoyment and any other use. I feel it belongs to the family of those who served and persevered within the Bang community.”

Richard T. Taylor, MoMM, (44-46, WP5,6) transferred from CSD 202 Relief Crew to BANG on Christmas Day 1944. He remained part of BANG's Crew for its successful 5th and 6th war patrols and then her return to Portsmouth. NH for overhaul. After a short period of peace time activity, Dick disembarked BANG for ComSubLanTAD on February 15 1946.

Dick and Ara were regular attendees of our Reunions but hadn't been to one in a while.

Dick's son, Richard, notified us of his father's death and also of his mother's (Ara) demise two months hence on October 26, 2015.

Augusta, Maine - Richard Thomas Taylor, 91, died Wednesday, August 19, 2015, at Maine Medical Center in Augusta.

He was born in St. Louis, MO, on January 30, 1924, to the late Earl and Aileen Taylor. As a young man he served his country in its time of need, 1943-1946, well and with honor as a submariner, motor machinist, 3rd class, in the American and Asiatic Pacific theatres. He spent many years working as an operating engineer for construction companies building dams and roads throughout New England and ended his working years as deputy chief of the Hartford Vermont Fire Department. He loved his family, skiing, the ocean, his pets, and had a wide range of other interests, in particular, building. He lived for 48 years in the White River Junction, VT area before moving late to Northwood, NH and then to Randolph, Maine. He was a devout catholic and member of St. Anthony's Parish in White River Jct., VT from 1964 - 2010 and St. Joseph's in Northwood, NH until his passing.





Merrill E. Carr, EN (54-55) reported aboard BANG from USS Trumpetfish SS425 in April of 1954 and was transferred to Nuke Power Training - Idaho in December 1955. The USPS notified us of Merrill's demise.

Though we were unable to locate an obit for Merrill, **Paul Schramm** was able to come up with the following:

He was born on October 4, 1924 and died on November 6, 2015. He was a career Navy Veteran serving in the WWII, Korean, and Vietnam eras and obtained the rank of Senior Chief Engineman. He is buried at VA Veterans Cemetery at Amelia, VA.

George G. Schmid, FN (51-52) was a member of BANG's second commissioning crew. He reported aboard BANG from USS Sea Robin SS407 in January 1951 and transferred to ComSubRon 10 in February 1952 while BANG headed to the yards for a major overhaul.

George's widow, Irene, sent us notification of his death due to lung cancer.

George G. Schmid, 86 died on Saturday April 30th at his home in Hillsborough, NJ. He was born and raised in Kearney, NJ and had lived in Michigan and Bridgewater before settling in Hillsborough in 1954. George was a Navy veteran who served in the Korean War. George worked as a carpenter for many years for Taggart International. He was a member of the Hillsborough Senior Citizens Chapter B and the Hillsborough VFW. He enjoyed fishing and watching baseball especially his beloved Red Sox.

He was predeceased by his son in law Stephen. Surviving are his wife of 60 years, Irene M. (Viggiano) Schmid, his 2 daughters, Dawn Grippo of Maryland and Debbie Clogher and her husband Richard of Ireland, his grandchildren, Alanna, Richard and Ella. Cremation will be private.


