



Carroll Graham "Gray" Mead passed away peacefully at the Vernon Green on Saturday September 14, 2019. When Carroll became a teenager he decided it would be easier to go by his nickname "Gray".

With the commencement of WWII Gray enlisted in the Navy. Before shipping out he married his sweet-heart Nancy. They were married for 61 years. During his 31 years in the Navy, Gray served as a sonarman and served on destroyer escorts, submarines, sub tenders and ice breakers. Gray served aboard the BANG as Chief Sonarman from 11March 57 to 22April 58 when he transferred to BLENNY (SS 324)

Wade Eichorn-Shipmate Wade Eichorn deployed on Eternal Patrol on 14 August 2019 at the Clyde W Copher Texas Veterans Home. Wade was cremated and his ashes were interred, along with his wife's ashes at the DFW National Cemetery. Wade served on board the BANG in 1944 and was on three war patrols that ended on 5 December 1944. Wade was the designer of the BANG's first battle flag.



Frank A Walker, Jr.-Frank A Walker shipped out on eternal patrol on 7August 2019. Frank qualified in submarines aboard BANG as an Lieutenant JG in 1952 until 1955. He also served aboard SPIKFISH before being released in 1956 as a LT.



George E Fedyna-Shipmate George E Fedyna deployed on eternal patrol 6 October 2019 at the Veterans Administration Center in Dover Wisconsin. George served on the BANG as a commissaryman from 1966-1969. where he gained fame for his innovative soupdowns. After mustering out, George worked in Real Estate and as a sales representative for home health care.



Lawrence O. Harjehausen-Cast off all lines and deployed on eternal patrol on 31 July 2019. Larry enlisted in the Navy in 1946 and spent 28 years as both enlisted and Officer. Larry transferred from

OCS Newport in 1957 and reported as an Ensign to the BANG. He disembarked from the BANG on 26August 1960 for ComSubDiv 21 Phila. Larry was a veteran of the Korean, Vietnam, and Cold wars. He was part of the initial crew of the USS NAUTILUS (SSN571) and was Commanding officer of the submarine rescue vessel USS TRINGA (AS16). He retired in 1974 with the rank of Lieutenant Commander. Of special note, while assigned to the BANG, Lieutenant (JG) Harjehausen was the designer of the BANG's "Sentry of the Seas" ships patch.



Gary Dannenbaum-Gary Dannenbaum Deployed on Eternal Patrol September 19, 2019. Gary was a plank owner of the USS GEORGE WASHINGTON (SSBN598) Blue Crew. Gary served on the BANG under Commanding Officer Stu Savage 58-59. Gary also hosted the BANG reunion in Albuquerque, New Mexico. After retiring from the Navy with the rate of Chief RadioMan, Gary taught school, and even tried a little acting, appearing in several movies and commercials. Gary attended several reunions and regaled all those present with his seemingly endless sea stories delivered in his trademark booming voice.

Ralph E. Chidley- Deployed on Eternal Patrol on October 22, 2019. Ralph graduated from Annapolis in 1954 and became one of the early personnel selections of ADM Rickover to be a part of the Nuclear Navy. Ralph served on board BANG from 3Jan58 to 3Dec59 where he achieved the rank of Lieutenant. He then transferred to USS GROUPER (AGSS214). Ralph went on to command two SSBN's the Ethan Allen and the Henry L Stimson. He was promoted to Captain in 1975 and was stationed outside Washington DC to take part in the development of the OHIO class "Trident" submarines. Ralph was the principle designer of that class of control room and led the development of the initial training programs

Herbert R. Ogden-Deployed on Eternal Patrol in May 2019. He was a member of the Commissioning Crew in DEC43. After leaving the Navy, Herbert became a Commissioned Officer in the Air Force and became a pilot. He retired from the Air Force he worked in Federal Civil Service

Dominic Frank Volonino-Deployed on Eternal Patrol November 11, 2019. Dominic was part of BANG's third commissioning crew in 1953. After leaving the BANG, Dominic was employed by IBM as a customer service representative. He transferred to the Tucson IBM plant in 1982 as a technical writer. He retired from IBM, but continued work as a contract technical writer until the end December 2000. Not one to stay idle, Dominic volunteered at the Tucson VA for 18 years. He said he worked in "transportation" meaning he pushed the gurneys and wheelchairs of patients far younger than he.



Robert E Hall- Robert E "Bob" Hall passed away in his hometown of Ledyard CT. September 4, 2019. Bob joined the Navy at age 17 and served on PT boats in the Pacific. His Navy career spanned over 23 years during which he also served on anti-submarine patrol aircraft in Oakland, California, destroyers in San Diego, California, and submarines in New London, CT. During this time he served on the BANG.

Daniel O. Dudley, SR- Deployed on Eternal Patrol on February 2, 2018. Daniel reported on board BANG 21NOV45 from S/MB NLC. He disembarked BANG 3FEB46 to PROTEUS (AS19) Other boats Daniel served on were O-3 (SS64), and PIKE (SS173)

Edward J Gurren Jr- Deployed on Eternal Patrol September 24, 2011. Edward was a plank owner, putting the BANG into commission 4DEC43 at PNS. He was a veteran of war patrols 1,2,3, Daniel served on submarines SS201, SS392, SS313, SS329, and SS393




