As the cover page said, lets try this again. It has been a heck of a year, and I, for one, could use a drink in the hospitality room. Well good news, we seem to be on track to realizing that goal. This quarters newsletter is a little late getting out, end of March for the digital users, April for the snail mail readers. The reason are these:

RADIO CALL SIGN PLYMOUTH ROCK

This installment of "Target" is the Sumner Class Destroyer USS HARRY E. HUBBARD (DD-748) Launched 24 March 1944 and Commissioned 22 July 1944. The Hubbard was a veteran of WWII, Korea, and the Viet Nam Wars. Our shipmate John Kraft was on board in the radio gang from 66-68. Harry Hubbard graduated from the Naval Academy class of '25 and was initially in submarines. He took command of the destroyer Meredith (DD 434) on 1 March 1942 and was part of the force that provided escort service for the carrier USS Hornet for the famous Doolittle raid on Tokyo. Later, he was tasked to escort transport vessels bringing much needed supplies to the troops on Guadalcanal. During one such op, the Meredith came under attack by Japanese carrier based aircraft and was mortally damaged. The Meredith continued to fight off the attack and no transport ship was lost. Finally, knowing the end was near a severely wounded Captain Hubbard gave the order to abandon ship and was the last one over the side just as his ship went under. Captain Hubbard later died in the rescue dinghy.

During the Vietnam Campaign, The Hubbard, with John aboard made a WESTPAC cruises escorting carriers as a plane guard. On one such duty, they were 2000 yards off the Port bow of the USS ENTERPRISE(CVN-65) when for some reason the EN-TERPISE'S CO decided to do a 165 degree change course and increase speed from 10 to 25 knots. Needless to say, CDR Bush, the Hubbard's CO was not pleased, and since was a "Mustanger" and had spent more than a few hours in the Bosun's locker, he made his displeasure known to the powers that were! I'm sure the language was not "Approved Officer Country" vernacular. By that time the Hubbard was an old ship, badly in need of refurbishing, you can see from the picture above she did not get the usual FRAM modernization so on 17 October 1969, she was decommissioned and stricken. I'm sure she was a true "home and a feeder" and took care of all her "boys" right to the end.

"I was in a hotel in Annapolis MD when Neil Armstrong walked on the moon. Not sure if the BANG was assigned by the brass or Capt. High volunteered, but the BANG took Midshipmen on a "Dive" in Chesapeake Bay. Now the "BAY" wasn't more than a puddle and for the Sonar Gang the prospect of planting the chin mounted sonar array into the mud was NOT a good idea. But there we were on July 20th 1969. Half the crew had "basket leave" on each of the two day ops...I was lucky enough to be on shore to watch the moon landing that morning and share some National pride with my shipmates. The fathometer got a work out, we survived and the BANG advanced another step to another "E" on the sail.

Not a crew member, just a friend. My interest in the USS Bang began many years ago when my close friend, RADM Alex Sinclair, was the CO 7/62-5/64. The notice of Lt. Michael Gothie 1963-1966 brought back a fine momory that Mike posted in the Sinclair Obituary Guest Book:

"Alex was a great officer and skipper. He presented me with his own Dolphins when I qualified on the Bang and I think of him often. He will be sorely missed." Mike Gothie.

This from **Lenny Sciutto:** I am writing to give you a brief update on my two books. My first book "THE DEVIL'S DELEGATION" is now being worked on by an editor. It is written in the 2016/2017 timeframe and has 40 chapters (94,000 words) and we are through the first 30 chapters. The basic theme is about a boy who becomes an orphan during Desert shield/Storm and blames the USA for the loss of his parents. Now as an adult, he devises a plan to steal an oil tanker, install a nuclear bomb in a cargo tank and sail the ship to Port Arthur Texas and detonate it , thus crippling the USA. Port Arthur is the #1 US port for the import/export of petroleum, chemicals and natural gases. The interaction between the good guys and bad guys make for an interesting story line, anyway that's what I've been told.

The second book "TANGO DOWN:CHINA SEA" IS A SUBMARINE STORY. It has 36 chapters(54,755 words). USS TAPRON lies deep and disabled in the China Sea, due to a new and unconventional Chinese mystery weapon. The race is on for the SSN CARDINALFISH to rescue the crew, if alive, and to identify the weapon. Will the Chinese reach the TARPON first, eliminate the crew, and steal her updated weaponry, or will the CARDINALFISH persevere and escape with any TARPON survivors. I have not been offered a contract on either book, but suspect the second one will get one. One company said it was worth considering for a movie, and four publishing companies are interested in TANGO DOWN.
